Measles

You may have seen in the news that there is an outbreak of measles across the country. Currently, the rate of the outbreak is the highest in the West Midlands area. Measles is a very infectious virus, which spreads quickly if people have not had the MMR vaccine. Two doses of MMR are needed for maximum protection. Measles can cause severe illness, especially in certain at-risk groups including babies and small children, pregnant—women, and people with weak immunity. Complications could mean hospitalisation, permanent disability, and in rare cases, it can even cause death. If adults or children have not had the immunisation, this can be requested at your GP surgery. You can request a vaccination that does not contain gelatine.

What do I do if a child has suspected measles?

Cold-like symptoms such as runny or blocked nose, sneezing and cough, red/sore watery eyes, high temperature (fever) which may reach around 40 degrees C, a non-itchy red-brown rash usually appears 3-5 days later (sometimes starts around the ears before spreading to rest of the body).


If your child has symptoms of measles which include the red-brown rash, please keep them at home and contact your GP or the agencies listed below.


