## COVID-19 appendix to Medical Policy Possible cases of COVID-19

We will have two isolation rooms for use in the KS2 building (intervention room and office next to staff room)

- Doors will be wedged open
- Windows will be open for ventilation

# Cleaning if there's been a suspected case in school

#### This section only applies to the site manager:

- 1. Clean and disinfect surfaces the person has come into contact with, including:
  - Objects which are visibly contaminated with body fluids
  - All potentially contaminated high-contact areas (e.g. bathrooms, door handles, telephones, grab-rails in corridors and stairwells)
- 2. When cleaning hard surfaces and sanitary fittings, use either:
  - Disposable cloths
  - Paper rolls and disposable mop heads
- 3. When cleaning and disinfecting:
  - Use the anti-viral solution provided
- 4. Make sure all cleaning staff:
  - Wear disposable gloves, mask and apron
  - · Wash their hands with soap and water once they remove their gloves and apron
- 5. Wash any possibly contaminated fabric items in a washing machine. Clean and disinfect anything used for transporting these items with standard cleaning products
- 6. Dispose of any items that are heavily soiled or contaminated with body fluids.
- 7. Keep any waste from possible cases and cleaning of those areas (e.g. tissues, disposable cloths and mop heads) in a plastic rubbish bag and tie when full.

## This section applies to all staff:

# If a child shows symptoms of COVID -19 (high temperature, continuous cough or loss of smell/taste) you should:

- 1. Ensure the child is comfortable and 2m away from all others.
- 2. Call a member of SLT immediately using your mobile phone.
- 3. If contact with the child or young person is necessary, then disposable gloves, a disposable apron, visor and a disposable face mask should be worn by the supervising adult.

### This section applies to SLT:

- 1. Accompany the child/children to the isolation room, wearing PPE (apron, gloves, mask and visor).
- 2. Comfort the child and explain why they are being separated from other people.
- 3 Notify MS
- 4. In the case of solely suspected high-temperature, use infra-red digital thermometer (kept in the main office) to take a temperature. If 38°C or above proceed to step 5.
- 5. Call home and wait with the child for collection.
- 6. Advise parent to book a test for COVID-19 immediately at the office.
- 7. Make follow-up call within 48 hours.

IF THE CHILD TESTS POSITIVE, THE WHOLE BUBBLE MUST SELF-ISOLATE FOR 14 DAYS.
